



# Update on the Surrey Fire Fighters' Charitable Society

#### Endowment Fund:

- $\Rightarrow$  \$4.5M in our Endowment Fund. 14% growth
- $\Rightarrow$  Added \$1.25 Million to the fund the past four years

#### Fundraising

- $\Rightarrow$  Revenue is up 30% consistently the past two years over \$1.1 Million
- ⇒ New revenue sources such as grants, individual donors, online donations, donor mail out cards, and member interest in major fundraising initiatives

#### Program Delivery

 $\Rightarrow$ We are delivering \$700,000 back to the community each year

#### Capital Campaigns Outlook = \$1.25 Million

⇒\$500,000—Surrey Hospital Mental Health
⇒\$350,000 – YMCA Gymnasium 'New' Surrey North
⇒\$250 000 – SFU Surrey Mental Health & Addiction research
